Faculty-Led Global Learning Program in Nepal

Combining academic learning with cultural immersion, outdoor exploration, and community-based experience.

Program Location

Kathmandu, Nepal

Arrival, orientation, and guided visits to UNESCO World Heritage Sites, including ancient Hindu and Buddhist temples and sacred cultural landmarks. Participants experience the cultural and spiritual depth of Kathmandu Valley before transitioning to the rural field environment.

Field Learning Highlights

Participants engage in immersive experiences that extend beyond the classroom and into the natural and cultural landscape of Nepal, including:

- Waterfall day hikes in the foothills surrounding Chautara
- Weekend white water rafting excursions along the Sunkoshi River near Sukute
- Guided exploration of local villages, agricultural terraces, and mountain environments

These experiences provide space for reflection, connection, and a deeper understanding of place-based living.
